About ILP



India Literacy Project (ILP), is a non-profit, volunteer based, development support organization dedicated to the cause of literacy in India.

ILP acts as a catalyst for a 100% literate India, a goal achievable in our lifetime, by supporting programs benefiting men & women of all ages.

The programs supported by ILP focus on *Education* for children and young adults, increase the *Employability* of individuals in the productive age-group and *Empower* communities across India.

Since inception in 1990, ILP has provided ~\$1.3million to support over 100 literacy & education programs benefiting over 100,000 individuals.

Through advocacy and community mobilization efforts to effectively utilize government resources, ILP has demonstrated that only \$3 from ILP can create an impact of \$100!

To empower every individual we serve with functional literacy and an understanding of their basic rights and responsibilities

Our Approach

Sustainable project models across age-groups

- § Early childhood development (0-6 years)
- § School education (6-14 years)
- § Life skills for youth (14-21 years)
- § Vocational training (Adults)

Scale successful models to larger target areas

- § Increase coverage in same area
- § Replicate in other areas

Advocate to bring about systemic changes

- § Create awareness of availability of government resources

In 2007, ILP plans to support 18 programs to the tune of ~\$185K, in addition to embarking on a large scale literacy initiative in Northern Karnataka. These efforts are supplemented by a unique scholarship & mentorship program for children rescued from child-labor and currently pursuing post-secondary education.



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
