FOREWORD BY CHAIRMAN

We have great pleasure in sharing the Annual Report of ILP for the year 2017-18.

The biggest challenge facing India's Schooling system today is to ensure that every child has equal opportunities for schooling, and equitable learning. The Government of India has laid the foundation to treat school education holistically from pre-school to Grade 12. Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan was created to merge three previously separate schemes viz., Sarva Siksha Abhiyan, RMSA and Teacher Education. The Government has also initiated National Career Services program to bring students closer to employment opportunities. Overall, the Government is strengthening the foundation to move young India towards higher socioeconomic mobility.

ILP has taken a holistic approach to designing, incubating, scaling and supporting programs from preschool to Grade 12, as well that lead to employability. For over two decades, ILP has closely aligned with the Government programs to maximize impact.

More recently, ILP streamlined pre-school education in 158 villages in Kalaburagi district, Karnataka. Based on our results, the Government chose ILP to train teachers in all 3,100 preschools in the district. ILP has also been supporting 18 primary school teachers in Vizianagaram, Andhra Pradesh to use an innovative Activity-Based Teaching/Learning methodology, and this program has now been recommended by the Tribal Department to be implemented in over 2,000 schools. For children in middle and high schools, ILP's Multi-Dimensional Learning Space (MDLS) program is providing a learning-rich environment that has improved their learning outcomes by 50%. This program is now being expanded through partnerships with Government and other non-profit organizations. For high school students, ILP has created a well-researched career counseling program, and is also providing scholarships to deserving students to create role models in their communities. Our counseling programs are currently reaching more than 50,000 students.

At ILP, we are aware that it is impossible for any organization to positively impact 25 Lakh Government preschools and schools in India, by working alone. Any solution towards improving our country's school education is realizable one by working with other non-profit and for-profit organizations, the Government and individuals like you. Our efforts to open source all our resources, our learning and our experience is a step towards this goal.

To each and every one of you, a sincere THANK YOU from Team ILP for continuing to believe in us, year after year and for enabling us to contribute towards this goal.

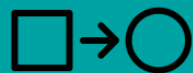

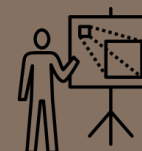

6. Career exposure and counselling

Conduct career exposure sessions for 9th and 10th grade

PAINTING COMPETITION

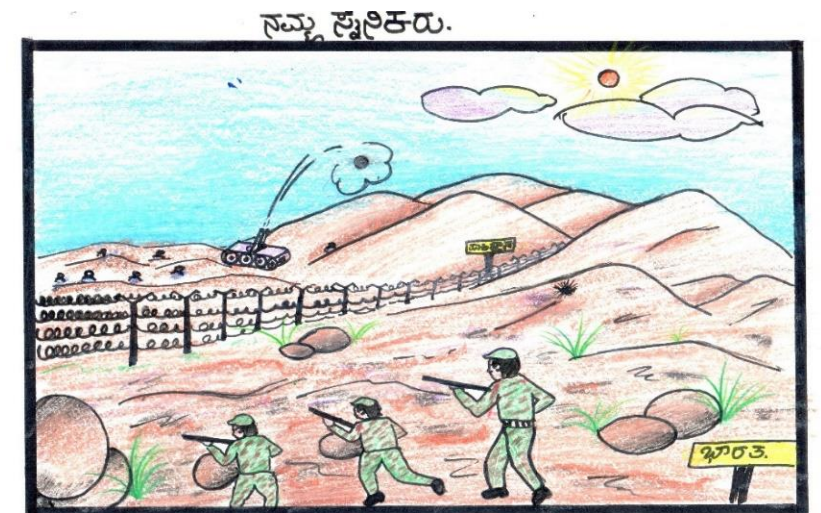
This year's painting competition - **more than 12,000 Student participated** from 193 schools across Gubbi and Pavagada.

Based on the first round, around 100 children were shortlisted for Taluk level competition.

Top 15 paintings from each category were given prizes.

More than 200 teachers **helped in organizing** event and there was encouraging endorsement from the State Education Department.

An event of this scale was conducted at a cost of just INR 7 per participating child, which included the costs for art supplies, material and prizes.



WORKSHOP ON HERITAGE EDUCATION FOR SCHOOL TEACHERS BY INTACH

On 25 – 26 April, 2017 at Vidyanikethan School @ Tumakuru

Heritage workshop was very successful with the participation of over 40 teachers + 12 motivators from ILP. The two day event was very well conducted by the INTACH team Ms. Purnima Dutta, Director of HECS (Heritage education and community service) INTACH New Delhi and Dr. Suresh, convener of Tamilnadu chapter of INTACH.

In the first session Ms. Purnima, through appropriate slide show spoke about the importance of heritage and introduced the four main themes.. Living, built, material, and natural components of heritage.

In the afternoon the participants were taken to a historical temple as part of field visit. This is in Kaidala , a small hamlet which house two temples dating back to 11 century. At the site Dr. Suresh explained the parts of a temple and about its architecture. It was a very enriching experience.

Then Dr. Suresh explained about local heritage showing slides of Badami, Pattadakal and Hampi.

Ms. Purnima then explained how and why of a heritage club in schools and how INTACH would support any school wishing to start one. She also spoke about the newsletter and urged the teachers and students to make contributions to it .

The next session was activity based where participants were divided into 5 teams and were asked to choose a heritage theme and show how they would involve children in it.

It was a highly energetic time when the whole auditorium came alive with each team wanting to do their best.

Heritage Quiz for Children: Organized heritage quiz program on 22nd July, 2017 at Gubbi Centre

Participated 32 children groups from 16 schools, Quiz have been held in two stages-a written quiz consisting of questions relating to History, Art and Culture of India.

The four teams who score the highest marks in this written Quiz have been invited to the second level of the city-level Quiz, One winning team selected for city level and participated in Bangalore Heritage quiz program on 25th July 2017.

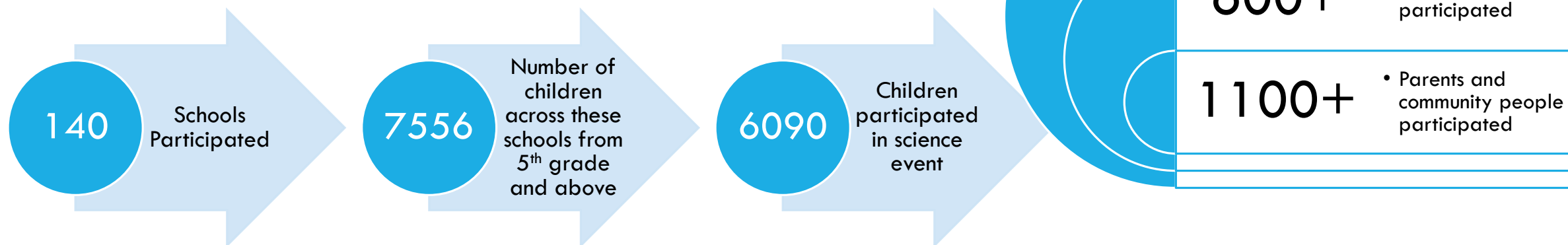
SCIENCE EXHIBITION: 195 SCHOOLS, 12500+ CHILDREN, 750+ TEACHERS, ONE EVENT

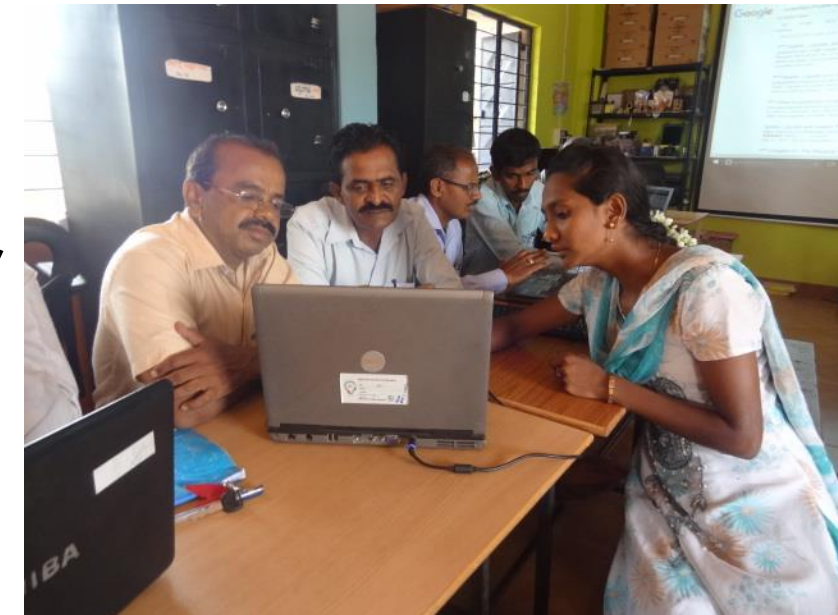

Discussed about MDLS implementation, teachers support & infrastructure issues.



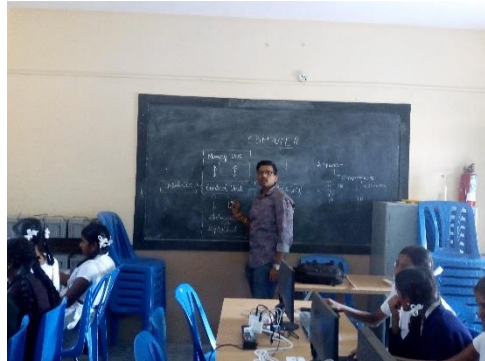
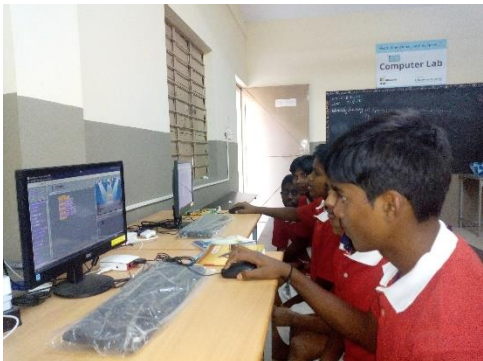
COMPUTER PROGRAMMING: SCRATCH

Computer labs in 8 schools were revamped using Raspberry Pi and existing monitors.

Two Motivator conducted courses on Basics of Computers and Computational Thinking for children in Grade 6 to 9.

During the weekdays, children worked on their own and completed assignments provided.

It was exciting to see the children's confidence improve as they learnt how to use the system and slowly, how to code. They did not want the class to end as it was "too much fun".



CAREER COUNSELING

Every year, we conduct a 2- phase career counseling sessions.

In the 1st phase, a 2-hour career exposure session is conducted in all high schools and in the 2nd phase, a post-results one-on-one career counseling session is conducted, to which interested students attended along with their parents.

This academic year we covered 63 high schools impacting 5000+ children.

One to one counseling on 9th & 10th of May, 70+ students came for career counseling with their parents.

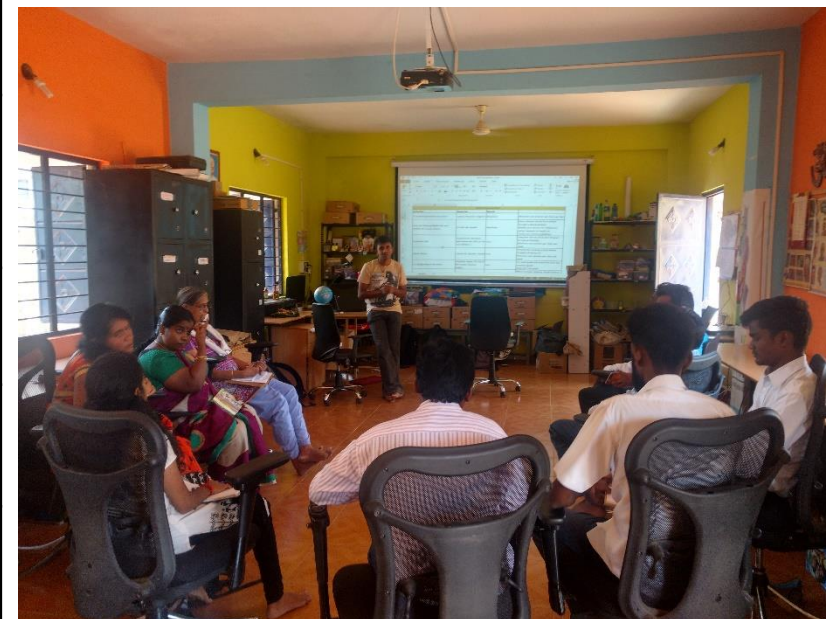

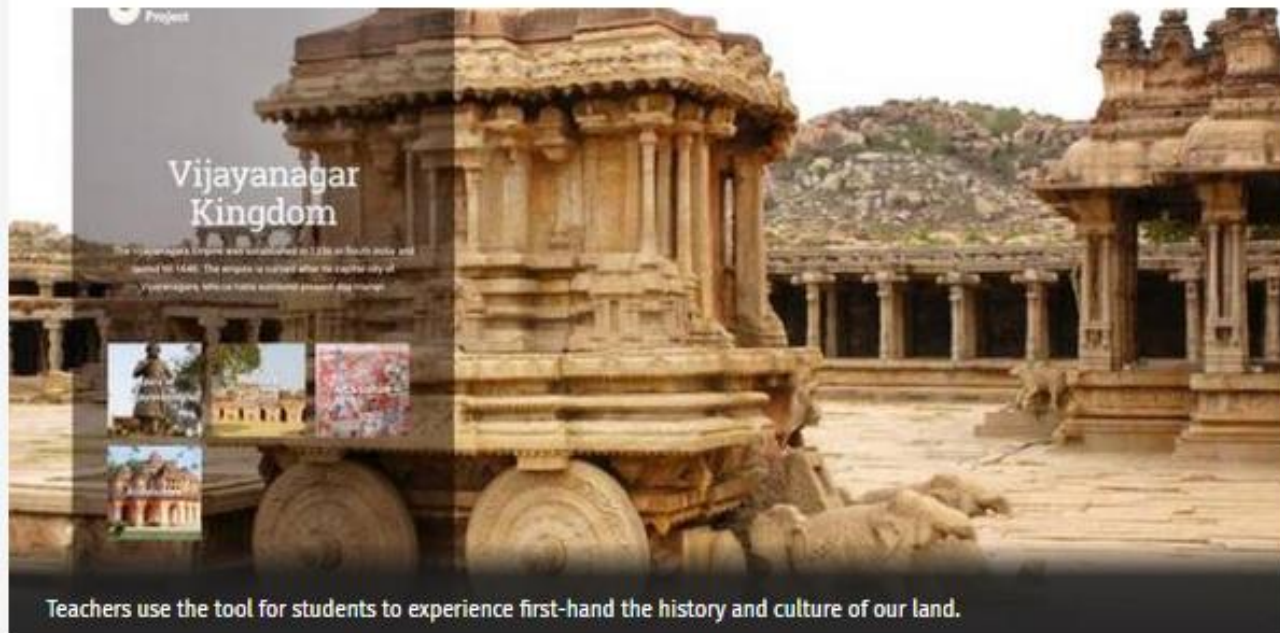

Google Earth Voyager's pilot project rolled out in 15 schools across Karnataka and Tamil Nadu

It takes a special knack to bring history to life from boring textbooks with flat 2-dimensional photographs. In schools, teachers often rely on visual aids and videos to grab the attention of students. Some classes, though, are travelling back in time using Google Earth Voyager, which allows children to explore empires and monuments in 3D.

Since its development in May 2017, classrooms all over the world have started using Google Earth's Voyager tool to delve into the past.

At Government Higher Primary School, Anthapura, Gubbi taluk, Tumakuru, the technology is being used to teach children about the Vijayanagar empire, which dates back to 1336 AD.

Social science teacher, Chandrakala R., has never seen students so eager for a history lesson. "I used the tool to teach my class 7 students, who were able to experience first-hand the history and culture of the people who lived at the time. We got 3D views of the Virupaksha temple and the Stone Chariot in the Vittala temple complex," she said.

This feature was developed after India Literacy Project, a non-governmental organisation, approached Google Earth to build interactive content for the Social Sciences component of their Multi-Dimensional Learning Space project that aims to make children explore, experiment, discover and learn in a variety of ways.

The stories developed through this initiative, focus on historical sites, kingdom and rivers, and are aligned with the school curriculum of four States: Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh.

A pilot project has been rolled out in 15 schools across Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.

The Indian Literacy Project has also conducted an orientation with 400 teachers. The pilot was for four chapters as part of the class 7 curriculum.

By the next academic year, they plan to reach out to 2,000 schools and 5 lakh children in the four States.

The stories are storyboarded using Google Sheets, which consists of all text and links to maps and other interactive content.

Pramod Sridharamurthy, Secretary, Board of Trustees (India), ILP said the idea was to give students an expansive view of different places and encourage exploration learning in the classroom.

“Many rural children may not get to travel, and may never get to see some of the monuments. All they would normally see are stamp-sized pictures in textbooks. With the Google tools, children can experience things almost as if they were really there,” he said.

Emily Henderson, Google Geo Education Outreach Program Manager, said: “Right now we are looking to see if students are excited about it and if it has helped them get hooked on to the lessons,” she said.

The answer, for now, seems to be ‘yes’. “It’s exciting,” said Renuka Prasad, who took the history lesson with Ms. Chandrakala. “I not only got to see pictures, but also videos of the places we are studying. It almost felt like we were there in that place,” he said.

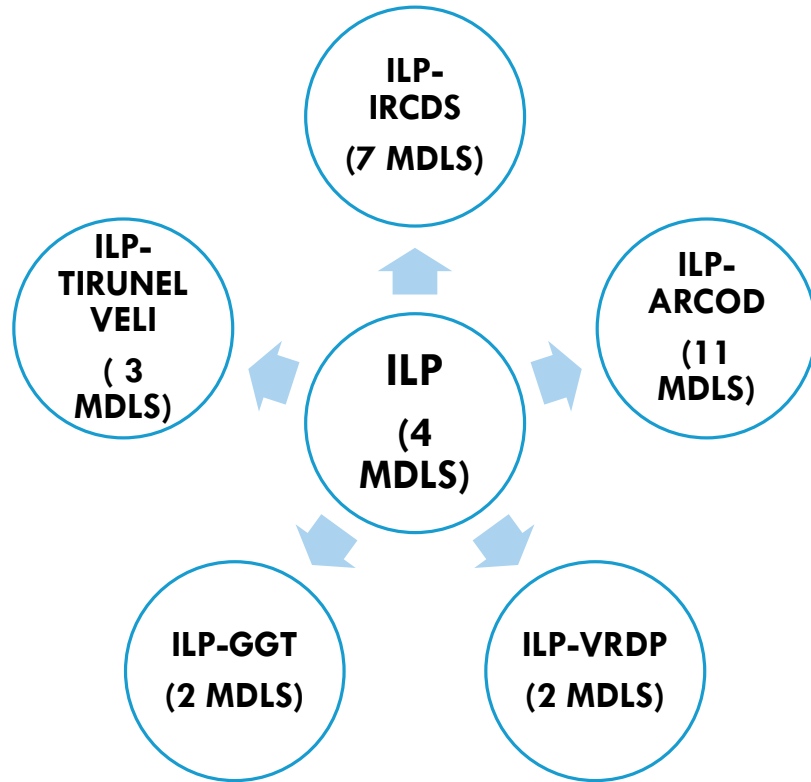

SCHOOL LIBRARIES

A library is not a luxury but one of the necessities of life. In the year 2016, We opened 5 libraries. Continuing our journey Dr.T Rajendiran, Chief Education Officer, Tiruvallur dedicated another 12 libraries in the Government Schools in December 2017 at a program at Govt. Boys Higher Secondary School, Avadi. Presently, 34 school libraries are working in TN through ILP partners covering around 10,459 children

Hippo Campus Reading Foundation's methodology of GROW BY Reading has been adopted as a tool for effective use of libraries.

Child friendly books by Tulika, CBT, NBT, Pratham, Eureka books have been procured & color coded as per GROW BY system. An app for accessing MDLS Library has been developed.

Ms.Bhuvaneshwari, of class 8, Govt. Girls High school, Velliyur, has topped in Tamil Essay writing in District level qualifying for the State Level competition. She expressed that ILP/IRCDS Library helped her immensely for the Competition.



GOOGLE EARTH

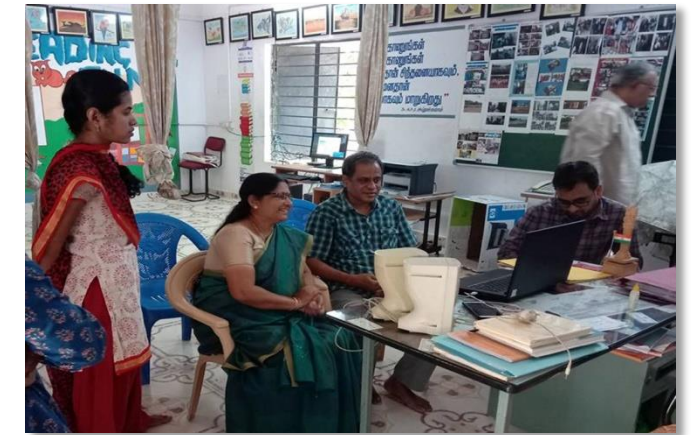

ILP is partnering with Google as content developer for Education track. Social science syllabus is mapped using Google earth.

ILP trained around **400** Social science teachers through Education department in Tiruvallur district.

Google UX researchers (from US and Australia) had interview sessions with many teachers in Chennai for feedback on the tool in the classroom.

Content development have reached completion.



CAREER WORKSHOPS & COUNSELING

Adolescents in High Schools are at crossroads faced by challenges at personal, emotional and career end, influenced by peers and pressured by expectations of parents and schools. ILP steps in at this critical juncture to support and help them take informed decision through the Career Counselling program for students of class 8 -12.

ILP's primary objective of Career counselling is to help students identify their potential and choose a field that is in tune with their capability, aptitude, skills and expectations of professions. Counselling students along with parents wherever possible has had greater impact. Students are now able to make a balanced choice of career rather than joining the rat race out of pressure!

ILP in association with IRCDS conducted career guidance sessions in various schools in Chennai, Kanchipuram and Tiruvallur districts from November 2017 to Jan 2018 covering 4,861 around students.

Information was shared with students on the courses available, fee structure, various entrance exams, deadlines for submitting applications etc.



SUMMER CAMPS



Ms. Sundaravalli, District Collector of Tiruvallur inaugurated the Summer camp at Vayalanallur village and deeply appreciated the tremendous work done by ILP in reaching out to migrant children during summer holidays. A total of **644** children enjoyed new and exciting experiences through these camps.

ILP, in partnership with IRCDS, SSA of Education department and DCPU of the Department of Women and Child Development conducted summer camps for children of migrant brick kiln workers, from 3rd to 8th standard. These camps were organized with the following main objectives:

- Engage migrant children during summer holidays to prevent them from reentering labour force
- Motivate children for schooling and academics
- Create a platform for the children to participate, interact, share, develop and showcase their talents

ILP Chennai Youth Chapter volunteers look forward to this annual event with great enthusiasm and this year was no exception!

Together with Teachers from SSA ILP conducted 5 summer camps from 3rd to 9th May 2017, at Thirumanam, Vayalanallur, Veppampattu, Annanagar, Poochiathipedu and Magaral villages for the benefit of children from migrant families working in brick kilns.



SCHOLARSHIPS

ILP's Scholarship program, started in 2014-15 provide opportunities to academically well performing students of socio- economically affected background to pursue higher education of their choice. In partnership with IRCDS, VRDP, ARCOD & HOPE presently 188 students are covered under this program. Counselling and Mentoring are two important interventions to support students further. Review meetings were conducted with the scholarship students at Tirunelveli, Tiruvallur and Krishnagiri to find out the academic progress, understand other needs, and soft skill requirements to equip them with required skill sets. Total money disbursed as scholarship is around **Rs.XXXXXXX**

STUDY PROGRAMS

Academic Performance Study In Tiruvallur District

On the request of the CEO of Tiruvallur District ILP facilitated detailed study in 14 Govt. High School and Higher Secondary Schools to understand factors that impact results of students of class X and XII in public exams. Reasons for lower performance, best practices in some of the schools and recommendations for changes at state, district and school levels have been shared in the report. The study covered HM, Teachers, students, parents, students who failed the exams, SMC members among others.

Support of Teachers in Government schools

The Study conducted by ILP revealed that most of the students fail due to vacancies of subject teachers. At the request of CEO, ILP extended support for six Para teachers, whose primary tasks were conducting revision exams and track students' performance periodically. This will help in improvement of academic performance of children leading to increase in overall pass percentage in +2 results.

MHRD SSA Study in Tiruvallur district

ILP & IRCDS teams also participated in a study on behalf of Datamation and Vidyadaan Trust on the working of SSA for MHRD. This is a third party evaluation on SSA's performance. The study was taken up in 25 schools, 5 schools each in 5 blocks of Tiruvallur district. It involved interaction with students, parents, teachers, SMC members, officials of SSA including BRP, BRC, CRC and APOs. The findings were shared with MHRD.

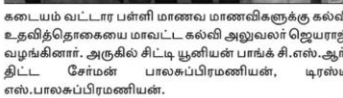

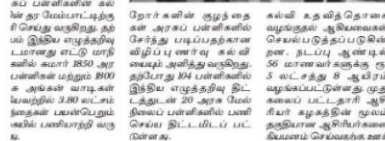

OVERALL PROGRESS TILL DATE

11 years of Pustakam project covered more than 10500 children across 12 schools. Pre & Post academic year assessment 2017-18 showed significant improvement in English language skills in students who attended the Pustakam sessions by ILP.

We have set up 14 in-school libraries in last 3 years. 8 of these are being run successfully by school staff.

After the successful implementation of two Mobile libraries, we now run 12 vans, catering to 72 schools and over 7000 students, with a repository of over 20,000 books for them. We also equipped some of the library vans with Kindle and low cost 3G/4G tablets for children to access the educational content online. In assessments of past 3 years, over 60% children improved their reading skills by one level or more with the help of the mobile library.

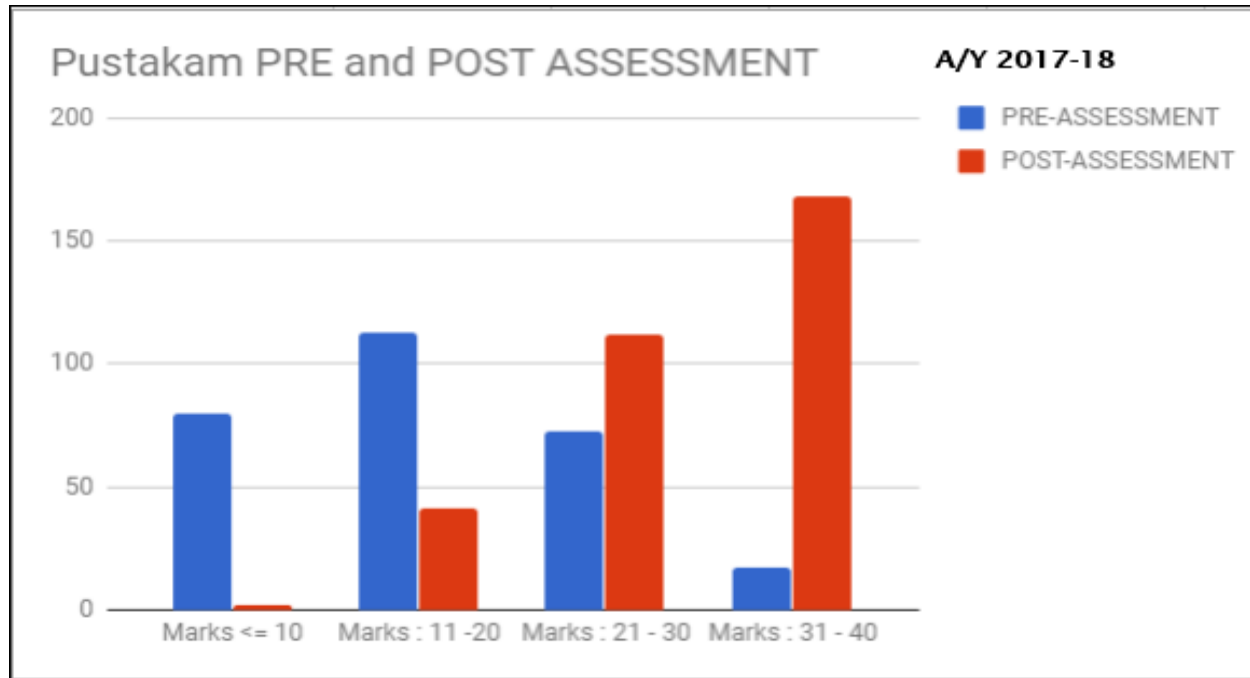

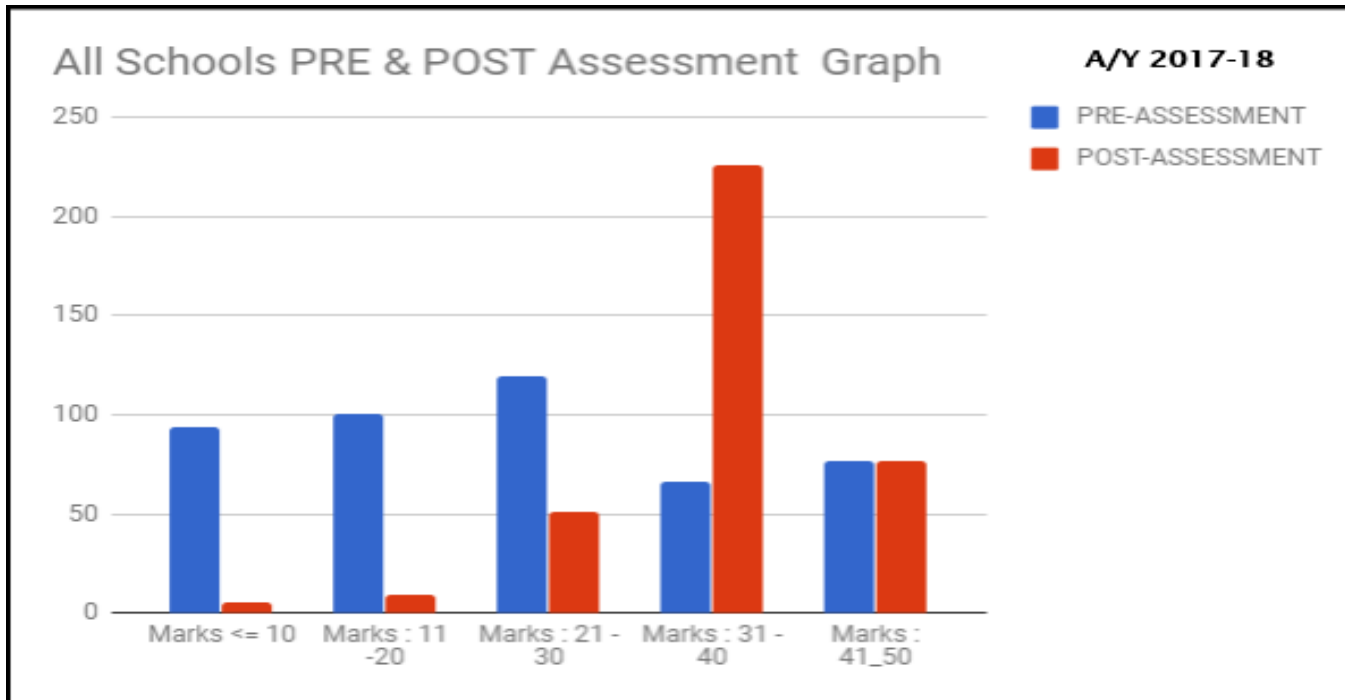

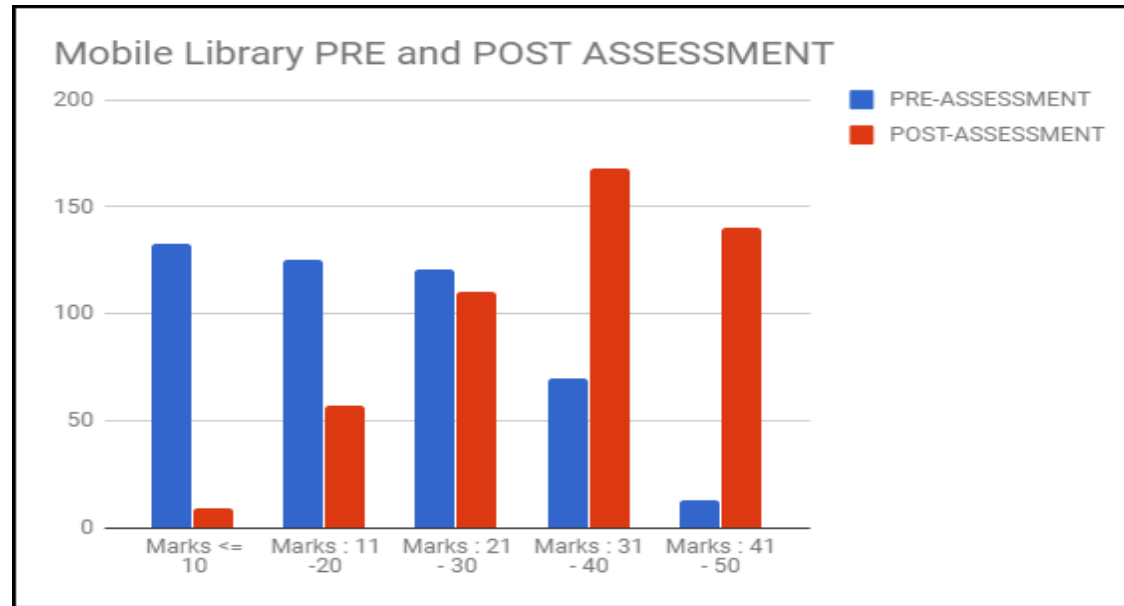

MOBILE LIBRARIES

After the successful implementation of two Mobile libraries, we now run 12 vans, catering to 72 schools and over 7000 students, with a repository of over 20,000 books for them. KEY ACTIVITIES IN 2017-18

TEACHER TRAINING - Through day long workshops with expert soft-skills trainers of multinational companies as well as through Tele-Mentoring in collaboration with ECHO India (using the Project ECHOTM model). Covered 50 teachers.

Art Competition - On the occasion of children's day , ILP conducted an Inter school Art Competition across 21 schools to create an interest in art among children. A total of 80 students were shortlisted for the finals, among whom 12 winners were declared.

Science Fair - As a part of the MDLS initiative, a science fair was held in 10 Upper Primary Schools of Shankarpally Mandal. The Science Fair successfully helped to create an awareness about the National Science Day (celebrated on February 28th) among 352 children and kindled a curiosity and interest on hands-on science projects

Summer Camp – Benefitted 1018 students across 6 schools for 15 days, with various activities such as yoga, art & crafts, self defense, basic computer literacy and dance classes. A medical camp was conducted at 2 schools with the help of Robin Hood Army.

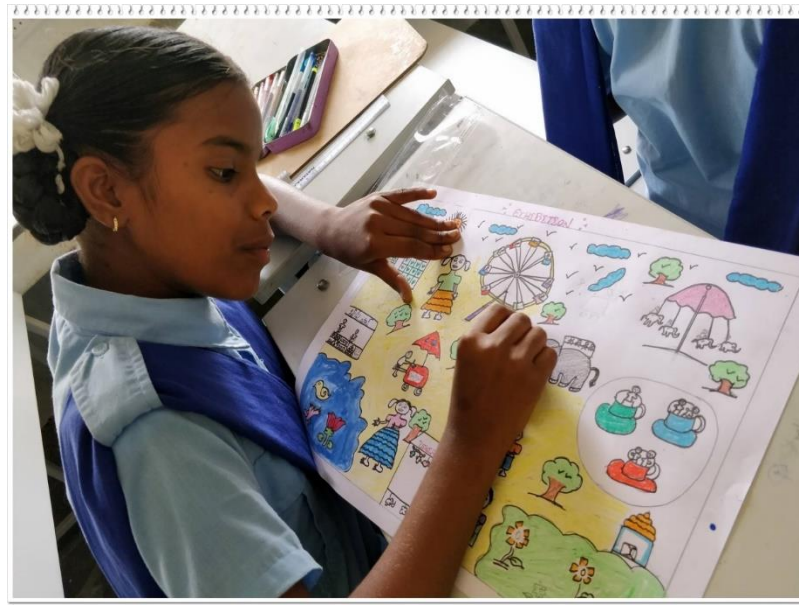
