Foreword

Over the past 20 years, India has increased her literacy rates from 52% to 74% despite the increasing population. Concerted efforts by the Government and non-Governmental organizations have resulted in 96% enrollment in primary schools. While these achievements are significant, much remains to be done.

ILP has been making access to quality education possible for many children in remote, rural and tribal areas of India. Using unique methods of engaging the local government, community, teachers, parents and children, ILP has been creating a sustained impact in a cost-effective manner.

Keeping children in schools, and ensuring continuous quality learning is a big challenge across India. ILP is taking on this problem by (a) templatizing the ILP Multi Dimensional Learning Space (MDLS) program, (b) providing para-teachers and remedial teaching, and (c) actively partnering with organizations that have developed successful teaching/learning techniques.

Students finishing high school find it difficult to understand the available choices for continued education. For first generation learners, there is minimal support to find answers. ILP's Counseling, Scholarship and Mentoring (CSM) program advises students about the available options that match their aptitude and interests. ILP provides scholarships to deserving students, and mentors them until they complete their education.

Through collaboration and teamwork, ILP is creating solutions that will sustain and scale. ILP team is focused on its journey to improve access to education, ensuring quality learning, and helping children transition from school to college and beyond.






Our Reach in Recent Years


3,166 pre-schools & schools across 8 states in India

Schools as Multi-Dimensional Learning Spaces

ILP's long-term goal is to transform government schools into fun and exciting learning spaces for children to become capable, confident, inquisitive and value-aware, and realize their fullest potential.

With the Multi Dimensional Learning Spaces (MDLS) program that ILP initiated in Gubbi taluk in Karnataka, ILP has created a structured, cost effective and scalable way to improve quality of education in the government schools.

MDLS program offers academic and non-academic exposure to children from an early age so that they can excel academically, as well as discover their interests and abilities. It achieves this by providing numerous avenues for a child's development within the school - smart/experiential classrooms, low cost Science/Maths labs, exposure to computers, a unique library program to improve reading levels, inter-school competitions, career guidance and extensive teacher training. To create a sustained impact, ILP ensures that children, parents, teachers, and government departments are always engaged in this collective journey.

The program results achieved in Karnataka, and the early positive signs seen in Tamil Nadu are fueling ILP's passion to transform every school into a Multi-Dimensional Learning Space.



MDLS Achievements in 2015 -16

- ✓ Implemented MDLS in all the 181 Government middle & high schools in Gubbi taluk
- Provided 181 schools with laptops and projectors to set up their smart classrooms
- Revamped 181 school libraries, and color coded 170,000 books according to varying reading levels
- Researched, developed and supplied 500 low-cost, science kits to all the middle and high schools in Gubbi
- ✓ Trained 1,350 school teachers across the Tumkur district upon request by the Government
- Conducted a painting competition in which 10,000 children participated
- ✓ Government mandated all high schools in Tumkur district to display ILP career guidance chart
- ✓ Many headmasters started raising local funds to accelerate MDLS implementation in their schools

Educating Migrant Children in Tamil Nadu

Tamil Nadu is a land of 3,000 brick kilns where 90% of the 300,000 workers are seasonal migrants from within and outside the state. In early 2012, an ILP survey in Tiruvallur district found that 99% of the young migrant children were not going to pre-schools; the situation was equally abysmal for children of school-going age.

These young migrant children wandered around the brick kilns, and were being exposed to serious safety hazards. Slowly, yet surely they were also being forced into child labor in the brick kilns.

ILP partnered with IRCDS, a passionate and experienced local NGO to begin transforming the brick kiln areas in Tiruvallur.

ILP & IRCDS made a deliberate and conscious decision to involve all the stakeholders in bringing about this change. Parents, brick kiln owners and all relevant government departments at the local/district/state levels were roped in. **This enabled ILP to expand its efforts from covering just 21 villages in 2012 to 282 villages in 2016.**



Achievements In the ILP Covered Brick Kilns


- ✓ 67% of 3-6 year old children of migrant families are attending pre-schools
- ✓ 85% of 6-14 year old children of migrant families are attending to schools
- \checkmark 98% of the brick kiln owners have appointed child caretakers in the kilns
- 87% of children continue their education even after they go back to their hometowns

Achievements At District & State Level

- ✓ State Govt. stipulated that ILP model must be followed with children from migrant families
- ✓ Tiruvallur Govt. helped to move over 6,000 children back in school in the last 2 years
- ✓ Tiruvallur Govt. appointed 88 education volunteers in 2016 to cover the migrant children
- Govt. is supplying native-language learning materials for children migrating from other states

We are at the cusp of transforming the lives of the brick-kiln workers' children forever. They can now continue their education without breaks even when their parents migrate for work.

Key Initiatives & Innovation

Large Scale Projects

To be successful across India, ILP partners with NGOs to implement programs in the field, collaborates with Government to effectively utilize resources, and garners community participation for sustainable change. Even in remote areas, we increase our impact by **implementing large**scale projects covering 50 to 200+ villages. Very few organizations have this kind of experience that is required to help 300,000 villages that are below the national literacy rate.

Multi-Dimensional Learning Spaces (MDLS)

MDLS is a unique program designed to make government schools a fun and exciting space for children to realize their full potential. It provides multidimensional learning opportunities for school children to explore, experiment, discover, and learn in multiple ways. MDLS also provides exposure to areas beyond the school curriculum. Our goal is to develop children into capable, confident, inquisitive and valueaware individuals with potential to become change agents in the society.

Counseling, Scholarship and Mentoring (CSM)

CSM is our integrated program to equip students to continue their education in high school and beyond. Counseling helps children understand their career options within and beyond their local economies, and what their next steps can be. Scholarships are enabled for needy students through the government, other NGOs, and ILP. Mentoring provides the selected students with academic and emotional support. and constant encouragement to pursue their dreams.

Knowledge hub

ILP's Knowledge Hub is a body of knowledge consisting of processes, tools and resources to guide and enable successful execution of literacy/education projects across India. It structures ILP's experiences into easily accessible digitized blueprints. It will serve as the one-stop for education-relevant online resources, and to connect with other resource experts. The Knowledge Hub is an enabling and connecting platform to serve NGOs, donors, Governments, researchers, policy makers, activists and many others.


